






#### EU SUPPORT FOR SYRIAN REFUGEES IN SYRIA AND IN HOST COMMUNITIES

# SETTING UP A NEW ASSISTANCE INSTRUMENT FOR EMERGENCY SUPPORT WITHIN THE EU





- Funding of €700 million for 2016 – 2018
- First priority -Greece: €198 million in 2016



- To respond to exceptional crises or disasters within EU Member States, which give rise to severe humanitarian consequences
- To fill a gap in EU instruments for emergency support inside Europe





#### **RELOCATIONS**

2 Council decisions:

July 2015: 40.000 persons

**September 2015: 120.000 persons** 

Persons arrived until 26 September 2017

<u>Implemented relocations in February 2018</u>: + 33.000

France: 4.700 (2<sup>nd</sup>) – Germany 9.200

Significant increase during 2017: 10.300

- regular relocations
- efforts by Greece and Italy

### **Candidates remaining:**

- 400 in Greece
- 2.000 in Italy

Infringement procedures launched against: Poland, Hungary, Czech Republic No judicial procedure yet

FUTURE: Reform of Dublin: corrective mechanism





#### RESETTLEMENTS

- Council decision of July 2015:
   Resettlement of 22.500 persons
  - + Agreement with Turkey

<u>Implemented resettlements in December 2017:</u> 26,000 persons

### Communication of 27 September 2017:

Call to Member States to resettle at least 50.000 persons by the end of this Commission's mandate (2019)

Africa + Turkey + Jordan + Lebanon

**Budget = 500 million EUR** 

February 2018: Commitment by Member States to resettle more than 40,000 persons (10.000 of which by France)






#### SAVING LIVES AND DISRUPTING SMUGGLING NETWORKS

9 out of 10 refugees and migrants have paid organised criminals and people smugglers




People smuggling networks made more than € 4 billion last year, exploiting the million migrants arriving in Greece and Italy








